Both *GramDef* and *GramEx*, as the names suggest are concerned with working with grammar. In *GramDef* test mode the learner is presented with six texts of increasing complexity and has to click on words to decide what part of speech it is. The program has a browse function to discover grammatical information about words. Every word in the text is linked to information about it and its function.

Extensive *Infogram* grammar help, largely leaning on *Thomson and Martinet* is common to both *GramDef* and *GramEx*.

These programs are useful to both native speakers and foreign learners of English.
