# TOEFL<sup>R</sup> Mentor<sup>TM</sup>

The information below is taken from the TOEFL Mentor promotional leaflet.

The TOEFL test, which has three timed sections of multiple-choice questions, measures the English proficiency of non-native speakers planning to study at colleges and universities in the USA, Canada and other English-speaking countries. More than 2,400 institutions require test scores from non-English speaking students. Although individual universities set their own requirements, the general score ranges are 400 or above for two-year programs, 500 or above for undergraduate programs and 550 or above for graduate programs.

The TOEFL Mentor is specifically aimed at English language instructors who need an effective resource for their TOEFL preparation courses, to use by itself or with other materials, or who need a self-study program to strengthen language skills, in the classroom, language lab or elsewhere.

It is also aimed at persons studying English as a second language at high intermediate or advanced proficiency levels who want to optimize their TOEFL score.

## Section I: Listening comprehension

TOEFL test measures the user's understanding of spoken English in North America. Part A – short conversations between two persons. Part B – longer conversations, about two minutes, between two persons and Part C: – talks/lectures, about two minutes. Total test – 50 questions, 35 minutes.

## Section II – Structure and Written expression

TOEFL test measures user's understanding of the structure and usage of standard English grammar; total test – two parts, 40 questions, 25 minutes.

Practice: TOEFL Mentor provides more than 270 exercises with explanatory answers: screen grammar tutorial with explanation/review of types of questions tested in Part A and B.

Test: In Part A the user must recognize correct sentence structure. In Part B the user must recognise errors in usage or structure; instant reply to check progress; randomisation of questions for test retakes.



## Section III: Reading comprehension

TOEFL measures the user's understanding of 5-6 academic content/style reading passages: total test 50 questions, 55 minutes.

Practice: More than 15 comprehension passages; explanations of question types.

Test: A variety of challenging academic content/style passages; 8-12 questions follow each passage.
